(Cross off the $y$ and add the suffix but not being -ing). | Adding -ed, ing, -er, and est to a root word ending in $-e$ with $a$ consonant before it. (Cross off the $e$ and add the suffix). | Adding -ed, ing, -er, and est to words of one syllable ending in a single consonant letter after a single vowel letter. (Double the consonant and add the suffix) | The 'ee' sound spelt with 'ey'. (To make these plurals you simply add 's') |
