SETTING WORK FOR PUPILS AT HOME

Staff Expectations

WHAT TEACHING STAFF ARE EXPECTED TO DO

Structure of the work

We expect teachers to spend an appropriate amount of time planning and resourcing tasks that enables students to continue learning the curriculum in each subject.

Teachers are expected to set challenging work for students that is in line with the curriculum plans.

Guidelines for structuring learning activities:

- 1. Primarily paper-based tasks
- 2. All children to be issued with a new exercise book
- 3. Prepare a timetable for setting out tasks for the week
- 4. Set the following daily tasks:
- Maths arithmetic and reasoning
- Reading, including comprehension tasks
- Writing and handwriting
- Spelling
- Times tables
- A weekly project to include: science, history or geography (this might be reflective
 of the missed classroom learning). This could include activities from across the
 curriculum e.g. D&T.
- 5. Home learning area on website will be updated with set tasks and signpost parents to useful apps/internet based learning.
- 6. Resend all children's logins home on one document.
- 7. Work will be collected by the teacher on the return to school.
